Well as many of you know, I forgot the meeting this month. It was a Freudian slip. I was actually at my son's house flying and waiting for him to finish making fish tacos from the fish he had caught that morning when Jimmy Russel called me to ask if I had forgotten the meeting. Of course Jimmy did a good job running things in my absence which makes me wonder what I should do next month!

Jimmy Russel also ran a great SPA contest this month. I believe there were about 15 registered flyers and we only lost a couple of planes. One was repairable, the other went into the lake. It was later rescued by some friendly boaters. Jimmy was poised to win expert until he did the wrong manuver after both he and the caller called the right one. Truely a brain fart. I struggled to come in 3rd in the master class. Dan Toombs was another flyer from the club and he placed first in his class. He managed to come away from the raffle with a nice Kwik Fly mark 4 kit that I had donated so he has the right plane to continue to climb the SPA score board. I am sure we did well financially but I don't know if Jimmy reported in on it yet as I was not at the meeting. We had great weather and a good time.

Another interesting thing happened on Saturday 6/18/2024. We had 20 active flyers at the field that morning! We are a growing club with lots of active flyers. We even have a few folks that don't have grey hair! Benches were shared and everybody did a great job of making sure everyone enjoyed themselves. Our club field is a really fun place to spend the morning.

I have dragged out the glider a couple of times recently and had fun soaring around looking for lift. It's a different kind of flying but challenging in it's own way. If you have a glider, dust it off and have some fun. This is another class of aircraft that has benefitted greatly from electric power. Put a small electric motor in the nose with a folding prop and getting up to the lift becomes easy.

Several of us have been kicking around what further improvements we could make to the field. One possibility that looks interesting would be to extend our shade structure west to the end of the concrete strip. On the the Saturday that we had 20 flyers, some were stuck out in the sun. We also ran short of benches. If we extended the shaded area about 50 feet west we could have about eight more benches and shade over them all. To this end I asked Steve Paterson looked into what a metal carport sort of structure would cost. He found some folks that would fix us up with a 12 ft wide, 10 ft high, 50 foot long metal carport structure (top but no sides) installed for \$5,000. That seems like a reasonable deal to me but let's all bring it up at the next meeting and discuss options. We can certainly afford it and I think it's worth doing.

The weather is getting pretty warm so make sure you are careful not to get overheated. Particularly if you are alone at the field. Remember we have cold drinks in the frdge at the field. Stay hydrated and enjoy.

Tree Feeding

At last count we had 4 planes in various trees around the field. It can be pretty tough to get a plane out of a tree without destroying it or hurting yourself, so be careful in this situation. A visit to the emergency room will probably cost more than a plane and healing will take longer than building a new plane so think about the rescue plan first.

Tree growth plays havoc with your depth perception and your habits from last year, so fly a bit high and stay in the open runway corridors to avoid feeding the trees. They are tall enough already!

If you have spoilers or flaps on your planes, now is a good time to get used to them. They will benefit you in the long run.
