Old Business

New Business

It was brought up that there have been several nails found in the gravel near the main shelter entrance. Dieter, Rick, and others have been doing their best to eliminate the problem, but nails keep showing up. Be careful!

It was also mentioned that whenever we get more gravel some should be placed at the field entrance to help eliminate the "mud hole" and the radiuses on the turns should be made longer to help cars from being driven on the grass.

Some members think something should be done about the turn going up to the unloading area as it is too tight and many worry that the corner of the new airplane shelter might be struck. It was mentioned that instead of entering from left to right, perhaps entering from right to left might temporarily help with the problem.

With the club trying to expand membership and with more women and children participating at our club events I suggested that a second porta potty for the women might be needed. Todd, the treasurer, said that he will check into pricing.

The April meeting will be held at Pellissippi State College, and for May hopefully we will be holding the meetings at the field for the rest of the summer.
